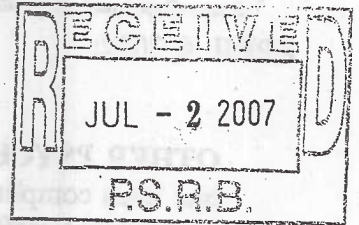


APRIL 4, 2007:

PSYCHOLOGY TRANSFER NOTE



DATE OF TRANSFER: April 4, 2007
SENDING WARD: 50C
RECEIVING WARD: 41A
DATE OF BIRTH: March 13, 1985 (age 22)
DATE OF ADMISSION: November 22, 2005
DATE OF REPORT: June 25, 2007

REASON FOR TRANSFER: The patient was transferred to this minimum-security residential transitional ward as the patient's mental status and need for transitioning services were an appropriate match for this setting.

BACKGROUND: The patient is a 22-year-old non-Hispanic Caucasian never-married male who is under the jurisdiction of the Psychiatric Security Review Board for five years until June 18, 2009, as a result of being found guilty except for insanity of the charge of Unlawful Use of a Weapon. His most recent diagnoses includes major depressive disorder, recurrent, severe, with psychotic features, and posttraumatic stress disorder on Axis I, and personality disorder, not otherwise specified on Axis II.

PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT REVIEW: Assessment of the psychological functioning was accomplished by chart review, observation at the initial Interdisciplinary Treatment Team session, interactions with the patient, and discussions with the ward staff. Review of the patient's records show that he has not completed high school or received a General Educational Development. Records note that he did not continue through grade school after the 6th grade and was home schooled by relatives. The reason given for not continuing with attending public school was anxiety. The records also show that he has had no military service, marriages, or dependents. The record suggests the patient denies a history of substance abuse. Review of the record notes reported suicide attempts and a lengthy history of suicidal ideation. The hospital records report a history of suicidal ideation while on medium and maximum-security wards, and has had episodes of aggressive behavior.

Review of the records show that a Psychological Baseline Assessment of Personality had been completed on January 9, 2006. Results suggest that the patient does have a negative and unstable self-image and poor interpersonal relationships. Results suggested an overall depressed mood, as well as affective in behavioral lability as that often is associated with borderline personality disorder, as well as narcissistic traits. The report did not address cognitive function.

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

OTHER PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES REVIEW: While on the ward, Mr. Giffen had been compliant with treatment requirements for engaging in groups and talking with professional staff when required. Since the time of transfer, additional psychological assessments have taken place and the patient has been cooperative.

PATIENT PROGRESS IN CURRENT FUNCTIONING: The patient has spent nearly three months on Ward 41A where he has spent most of his time socializing with peer, age, and gender residents, particularly in activities that involve computers and the like.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Continue medication management with treating psychiatrist.
2. Assess cognitive function and make recommendations.
3. Review Treatment Care Plan for appropriate changes.
4. Utilize past and current testing to complete Psychology Baseline and Risk of Violence assessments as required, and requested assessments as the need arises.
